



Detailing Tips and Tricks by Mat Allison

Interior Detailing Tips:

Maintaining the interior of your Porsche requires the right products and techniques to preserve its premium feel. Regular detailing keeps it looking pristine while protecting materials like leather, plastic, and carpet from wear. Whether you're preparing for a show or just want that fresh-from-the-dealer look, here's a few ideas to get you started:

1. Gather Your Supplies

Before diving in, make sure you have:

- Microfiber towels (soft and non-abrasive)
- Leather cleaner & conditioner (for seats and trim)
- Interior detailing brush (for vents and crev-
- Vacuum with attachments (for carpets and
- Glass cleaner (for windows and screens)
- All-purpose interior cleaner (for plastics and 6. Polish Glass and Screens vinyl)
- provide deep nourishment, but some cheaper options might contain harsh chemicals that can dry out leather over time.

2. Start with a Thorough Vacuum

Begin by vacuuming the seats, carpets, and floor mats. Use a crevice tool to reach tight spaces, ensuring no dust or debris is left behind.

Pros & Cons: Cordless vacuums offer convenience and flexibility, while corded models generally provide stronger suction but limit mobility.

3. Clean and Condition Leather

Apply a high-quality leather cleaner to seats and trim, wiping gently with a microfiber towel. Follow up with a leather conditioner to keep the material soft and prevent cracking.

Pros & Cons: Spray-on leather conditioners are quick to use but may not provide long-lasting protection compared to cream-based conditioners.

4. Wipe Down Hard Surfaces

Use an all-purpose interior cleaner to wipe down the dashboard, center console, and door panels. A detailing brush can help remove dust from air vents and buttons.

Pros & Cons: Silicone-based cleaners can add shine but might leave a greasy residue, whereas water-based formulas offer a more natural matte finish.

5. Refresh Carpets and Floor Mats

Spray a carpet cleaner on mats and carpets, scrubbing gently if needed. Let them dry completely before placing them back in the car.

Pros & Cons: Foam carpet cleaners penetrate deep stains but can require more drying time, while spray-on cleaners work faster but may not be as effective on stubborn spots.

Pros & Cons: High-end leather cleaners often Use a streak-free glass cleaner on windows, mirrors, and infotainment screens. Avoid ammonia-based cleaners, as they can damage tinted windows.

> Pros & Cons: Alcohol-based glass cleaners evaporate quickly for streak-free results but can be harsh on tinted windows, whereas ammonia-free cleaners are gentler but may require extra wiping.

7. Add Finishing Touches

If desired, apply a UV protectant to dashboard surfaces to prevent sun damage.

Regular maintenance will keep your Porsche's interior looking showroom-ready. As always, if you want to learn more, the internet has many ideas - and opinions - on car detailing.

A Dream Reignited: The Reaper Returns in Porsche's Restoration Challenge

This Contest vehicle began life as a Grand Prix White 1990 Porsche 964 C2. In the 1990s, it saw action on the East Coast in PCA Club Racing, equipped with a 500hp Protomotive single-turbo kit. But no one could have predicted that a young kid hanging around Midwestern Auto Group (MAG)—a budding Porsche enthusiast—would become the Reaper's future owner.

That kid was Chip Richardson.

Like the 997 "I'll be back" commercial, Chip had the bug. He used to ride his bike—and later drive his GTI—to MAG, pestering Eric Friend, Kevin and Becky King, and anyone else who'd listen. He eventually connected with Porsche Master Tech Matt Gossman, who took him under his wing and mentored him in every facet of Porsche maintenance. Despite being warned by the "safety police" to stay out of the service area, Chip was known to sneak back in regularly.

After high school, Chip used the money he earned working at Coyle Music to buy a 944 Turbo. Naturally, he joined MORPCA (Mid-Ohio Region PCA). On weekends, he and Matt converted the car into a Turbo S replica. But Chip never forgot the 964—the car he had first seen in the showroom at MAG, the one that had started it all.

In 1998, during medical school, Chip launched a Porsche parts and tool business to support his growing obsession. He became friends with Chip Vance, Martha and Steve Southard, Bob Fergus, and Randall Blanchard from MAG's Body Shop. Eventually, Chip found his 1990 C2: a rolling chassis with a blown engine, located in New Jersey. He brought it home and, with help from Sugarcreek Motor-

sports, built a 3.8L engine inspired by the legendary 964 RSR. He drove the car on the street and in autocross events, but the vision was always bigger: a wide-body restomod.

In 2004, Chip and his wife stripped the 964 down to the unibody.

And then...it sat. For 20 years.

When the air-cooled restomod movement gained steam, Chip took notice—but felt most builds were compromises. Nostalgia often came at the cost of performance. He began to imagine something completely new: a body with modern aerodynamic principles, enhanced using CFD (computational fluid dynamics) simulations with the Automotive Research Center in Indianapolis. A new engine concept took shape as well. The dream was gaining focus.

Then came the Porsche Restoration Challenge.

Chip reached out to the very people who had supported him as a teenager. Now at Byers Imports, they remembered him well—and the incredible story behind the car. Though they hadn't yet entered the Contest, they knew this was their chance. In the "Individualization" category, it was a perfect fit: the embodiment of Sonderwunsch—Porsche's philosophy of turning dreams into reality.

Today, the Reaper is an official entry in the Porsche Restoration Challenge. For Chip Richardson, it's more than a car—it's the culmination of decades of passion, persistence, and an unrelenting dream finally coming to life.
