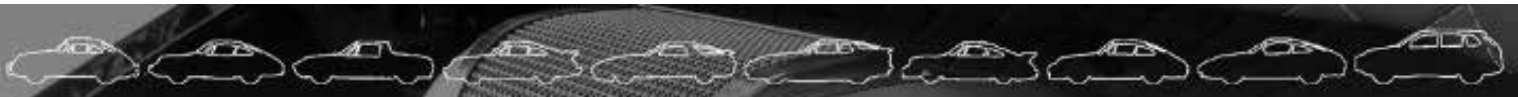

Come join us in Pittsburgh, PA! **Great Drives – Laurel Highlands** is a social and driving event with an opportunity to stretch your Porsche's legs in a gorgeous mountain area with pampered lodging and delicious meals. It's designed to appeal to **both** the driver and navigator, although a navigator is not necessary.

The Laurel Highlands of southwestern Pennsylvania is a scenic mountain region of winding roads, sweeping overlooks and home to architectural masterpiece Fallingwater, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. The area also includes the solemn Flight 93 National Memorial near Shanksville, a place of reflection honoring the 40 passengers and crew of United Flight 93 who heroically perished on September 11, 2001.

We will be staying in the restored, historical Omni William Penn Hotel in downtown Pittsburgh. On Wednesday we will enjoy a reception dinner, followed by two days of nice drives on curvy, picturesque roads arriving at **Fallingwater** on Thursday and **Flight 93 National Memorial** on Friday. We will have a nice lunch as part of the Thursday and Friday drives. Thursday night will include a delicious dinner at Talia's a half a

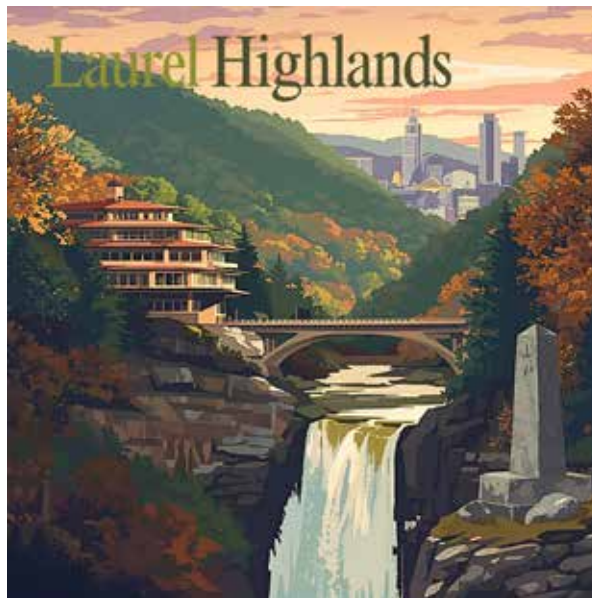

MORPCA Business Minutes for March 9, 2026

Meeting called to order by Kevin Hennessy, Communications Co-Chair, at 6:30 p.m.

Attendees: Kevin Hennessy, Patrice Hennessy, Dave Stetson, Stephanie Stetson, Linda Grossglass, Hal Grossglass, Frank Todaro, Akash Vaswani, Jose Isern, Jennifer Reynolds

President's Report by Steve Eisenbrown, President: Steve couldn't attend the meeting and there was no report to share.

Treasurer's Report by Vicki Kilbourne, Treasurer: Vicki couldn't attend the meeting but sent a final reminder to send in 2026 budgets for approval.

Advertising by Akash Vaswani, Chairperson: Advertising invoices were sent and we're making sure money is being sent in return. Akash welcomed new advertisers, P3 Autokrafte and The Wyler Collection (TWC). Akash will follow up with an additional potential advertiser, identified by Jeff Brubaker. Fine Shine and Columbus Car Audio didn't renew their advertising contracts. Akash and Kevin will work together to update the email banner of advertisers and communications to reflect changes. Patrice and Frank both thanked Akash for his work in developing more advertising relationships in the MOR region.

Standing Committee Reports

Membership by Linda Grossglass, Chairperson: Linda reported there were five new members, no members transferred in, three transferred out, with a total of 1168 members. Linda shared that the membership reports from PCA have been updated to include members, affiliates, and associates. New members should watch for emails (check inboxes and junk folders) from the club, typically from communications@morpc.org. There was discussion about developing ways to get members together who live closer to the outer edges yet within the boundaries the MOR region.

Newsletter by Debra Stoner, Newsletter Editor: Debra couldn't attend the meeting but is always looking for member content (articles and photos) that can be included in DOS. Send content to newsletter@morpc.org.

Communications by Kevin Hennessy, Chairperson: Kevin requested updated, detailed information that can be included in emails and communications for upcoming club events.

Social Activities by Frank and Melinda Todaro, Chairpersons: Frank reported the Third Thursday social activities have been scheduled through August. The first event will be Thursday, April 16th, at TWC in Dublin with Triple P Barbeque food truck. September and October remain open and to be determined. The proposed Thursday, August 20th, event at 80 East in Powell will be a ticketed event for food and a limited number of drinks; then, if people wish to open a tab they may do so. There was discussion about using the

parking spots closest to the venue as a Porsche showcase that could raise money for charity. Frank is talking with advertisers to develop the fall activities, including an event that would focus on the Columbus 500 with a one-hour presentation given by an historian.

Concours/P2O by Mat Allison, Chairperson: Mat couldn't attend the meeting but sent his report. Planning continues for the MORPCA car show part of Arthritis Foundation's classic car show event. Frank reported there will be a cars and coffee social in the morning with a car corral for the day. Detailed planning is underway.

Driving Events by Kevin Hennessy and Mike Stoner, Co-Chairpersons - HPDE Frank reported that 80 - 85 people are registered for the June HPDE. The DE team will meet on March 21st to plan. The HPDE co-hosted with NNJR is tentative due to a large concert event the July 17th weekend in the area that limits available hotel rooms. A decision will be made to continue or cancel 75 days before the date. PCA Club Race is on hold for 2026.

Teen Driving - Andy Welter is planning teen driving events, with up to three Maria's Message dates along with a possible Tire Rack Street Survival date at the Safelite campus.

Drive and Dine - Jose Isern reported that events are being arranged with the first drive scheduled May 30th to The Lafayette Hotel in Marietta. Lunch will be \$30/person. Kevin thanked Jose for his efforts with Drive & Dines and noted the events are very popular with club members.

Great Drives - Jose reported - Laurel Highlands planning continues.

Autocross - The search for pavement continues, and the club is looking for connections to facilitate a location.

Safety by Chip Henderson, Chairperson: No report.

Technical by Jeff Brubaker, Chairperson: No report.

Philanthropy by Mike Stoner, Chairperson: No report.

Old Business by Steve Eisenbrown: Linda and Kevin reported that the new member welcome letter has been updated with new contact information. There was discussion about including a hospitality tent at the July car show to welcome new members.

New Business by Steve Eisenbrown: Frank reported that the HPDE planning meeting will include discussing the chief driving instructor role and other volunteer roles to reflect updates in the club technical rules. There will be multiple events to encourage DE participation for those new to DE, including "taste of the track" events and a Drive & Dine to the track for parade laps for charity.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:21 p.m.

The meeting began at 6:30 p.m.

President's Report by Steve Eisenbrown, President: No report.

Treasurer's Report by Vicki Kilbourne, Treasurer: All reports are out. The budget has a small number of line items yet to be completed. Vicki will let Mike know what items are needed. Mike thanked Vicki for her service as treasurer and welcomed Jim Lesser to the Business Meeting as a potential treasurer.

Advertising by Akash Vaswani, Chairperson: Akash couldn't attend the meeting but sent his report. Akash announced new advertisers: The Wyler Collection, K-ceps Autobody, and Esoteric. All are interested in participating in club events, and Esoteric also is open to HPDE involvement. Akash shared with Debra and Kevin ad creative and banners, to be used in the newsletter and communications. He drafted dedicated emails for advertisers to share for feedback. Akash reached out to advertiser Middle West Spirits for an update.

Membership by Linda Grossglass, Chairperson: Linda reported 14 new members, one transfer out, zero transfers in, for a total membership of 1170.

Newsletter by Debra Stoner, Editor: Debra couldn't attend the meeting but requested articles and content for the newsletter.

Communications by Kevin Hennessy, Chairperson: Kevin is sending out emails with the new advertising banner format. He is managing the calendar of email blasts to members. When the IT infrastructure auto pay bills are received, Kevin reminded the Board they will be forwarded to the Treasurer.

Social Activities by Frank and Melinda Todaro, Chairpersons: The first Third Thursday Social is April 16th. Attendance at club socials has been increasing. The price of attendance is now \$7.50, including the Ticket Tailor ticket fee, which helps supply better wine, beer, and non-alcoholic beverages. Horsepower Farms will be the location of the May social and Executive Storage Estates for June. Frank and Mat Allison are working together to create activities for the Arthritis Foundation MORPCA Car Show in Dublin with a hospitality tent for a cars and coffee-style social on Saturday morning. Frank is working on another activity with a charity component to be held at Canine Companions in New Albany. "Puppies and Porsches" will offer an opportunity to tour the organization and raise money. Frank and Melinda are supporters of Canine Companions which helps train service animals so that people with disabilities may live more independently. That will be the final Third Thursday Social of 2026. Frank and Mat discussed an additional Porsches-only Cars and Coffee to be held August 8th, location to be determined. They are considering opening it as a way for members to engage with MORPCA and advertisers. Frank discussed offering coffee and donuts and using Ticket Tailor to track attendance.

P2O/Concours by Mat Allison, Chairperson: Mat was unable to attend but sent his report, which Frank discussed, above. Mat is open to additional suggestions and events for Concours.

Driving Events by Kevin Hennessy, and Mike Stoner, Chairpersons: HPDE has 135 drivers registered. A DE planning meeting was held at The Wyler Group. Frank proposed a Members Day at the Track for Saturday for members to come

as part of the Drive & Dine activity or on their own for an opportunity to drive Charity Laps, attend a HPDE light overview session, and/or drive with a DE instructor for \$25. Hosting a 60th Anniversary of PCA Party at the Mid-Ohio track was discussed. During the DE planning meeting, the group discussed the PCA requirements on track driving events. The group discussed expanding the CDI program with the required HPDE experience. Mike and Kevin are working this month to list out responsibilities of instructors, create a list of experienced and potential DE instructors to expand the instructor program, and develop ways to recognize the CDI and instructors.

Autocross: The search for pavement continues. Frank reported that he would be happy to be a bridge for discussions between MORPCA and SCCA regarding Autocross. Frank will follow up with Ryan Heidenreich and Matt Scott.

Drive & Dine: Jose Isern reported that he prepared and ran a preview of the Dine & Drive to Marietta on May 30th. Lunch will be held at The Lafayette Hotel with a limited menu instead of a buffet which would have cost \$30/person. He expects the spots to fill once the email blast goes out to members.

Great Drives: Mike reported the Great Drives Pittsburgh extended drive (July 22nd - 26th) is nearly ready for an email announcement. Registration will include tickets for Fallingwater, the Flight 93 National Memorial, along with some meals. Members will stay at the Omni William Penn Hotel (hotel not included). Registration will open soon.

Teen Driving, Maria's Message, TRSS: Three dates are now arranged for 2026 for the club's teen driving program with Maria's Message. TRSS will be held on the Safelite campus in Late September. Andy Welter will be looking for volunteer instructors to help train young drivers. Kevin reported to the group that Ticket Tailor has helped with managing the RSVP process.

Safety by Chip Henderson, Chairperson: No report.

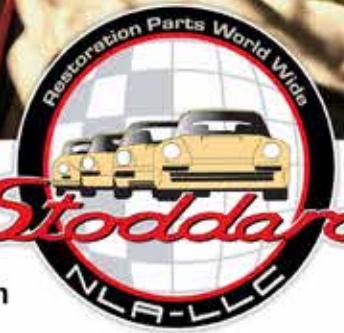
Technical by Jeff Brubaker, Chairperson: Planning is underway for a Trickle Charge in November.

MORPCA has a formula to calculate how much MORPCA can contribute, which is \$3800 for 2025. Mike identified potential charities including Canine Companions and Mid-Ohio Food Collective.

Old Business by Steve Eisenbrown, President: No report.

New Business by Steve Eisenbrown, President: Steve thanked Vicki for her service as Treasurer to the club, particularly for serving her full term and much more. Steve and Mike met with Jim Lesser as a potential MORPCA Treasurer. Jim was a former treasurer with the BMWCCA, Northern Ohio chapter, is retired, has enthusiasm for MORPCA, and is interested in the open position. The group thanked Vicki and welcomed Jim. In addition, the board will be looking for a membership chair. Debra will be working on Form 990 in order to submit it to the IRS before May 15th deadline.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:41 p.m.
