Debra and I joined nearly 2,300 PCA members at the 70th annual Porsche Parade in Lake Placid, New York. Surprisingly, this was only our third Parade in 19 years of active PCA membership. After attending, I came away convinced that more MORPCA members should consider experiencing a future Parade.

Parade is PCA's largest annual gathering, rotating among destinations in the East, Midwest, and West. It offers an incredible variety of activities, including a judged Concours, autocross, driving tours, technical quizzes, sim driving, an art show, golf tournament, 5K run, banquets, TSD rallies, gimmick rallies, remote-controlled cars, and a robust Juniors program for children of all ages.

In short, there is truly something for every Porsche enthusiast.

Some activities are clearly outside my skill set. Unlike Stephanie Stetson, Kathy Isern, and many others, I have absolutely no artistic talent, so you won't find me entering the art show anytime soon. That said, I never miss the opportunity to walk through it. The quality and variety of the artwork is remarkable, and every piece reflects a passion for Porsche.

For Debra and me, the biggest draw was participating in three of the daily driving tours. These tours are very similar to the Drive & Dines that Jose Isern organizes for MORPCA. That's one of the appealing aspects of Parade: no matter how much you do, there always seems to be something new to try next time.

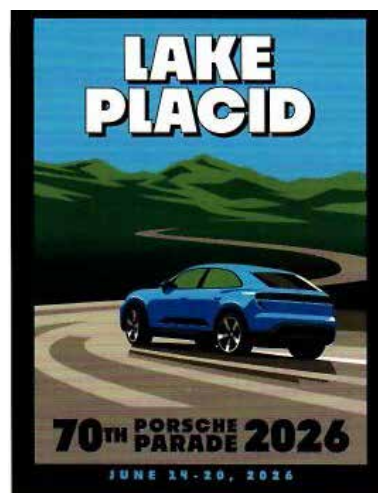

MORPCA Business Meeting Minutes - June 8, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m.

President's Report by Steve Eisenbrown, President: No report.

Treasurer's Report by Jim Lesser, Treasurer: Reports are out and accounting is up to date. Square software to process in-person payments has been registered. Frank tested the software. Jim will look into and order the most efficient device for using the software.

Advertising by Akash Vaswani, Chairperson: No report. Mike noted a lack of response from Middle West Spirits regarding renewing their ad and made a motion to remove them from the club newsletter. Frank seconded the motion. No issues were raised and the motion passed.

Membership by Linda Grossglass, Chairperson: Linda reported nine new members, three transferred in, two transferred out, for a total of 1154.

Newsletter by Debra Stoner, Editor: Debra reported that she is looking for articles for the newsletter. Her deadline is June 22nd. Frank will send messages to the advertisers to encourage membership engagement and newsletter article submissions. Steve will write about the MORPCA and its 60th anniversary.

Communication by Kevin Hennessy, Chairperson: Kevin reported that he is sending out club emails according to the calendar. Chairpersons are welcome to make changes to their related content. Communication is working well, and Kevin noted that members interested in registering for events can pick and choose multiple events on the box office page. The website's Contact Page is seeing more traffic over the last year. Kevin, Linda, and Steve all see those messages and Kevin also forwards the messages to the right contact person. There was discussion about the club's Facebook account, which is a public page, running event notices from other car clubs in addition to MORPCA's events. Frank also posts MORPCA events on other club FB pages. Kevin noted that the page isn't actively managed currently.

Social Activities by Melinda and Frank Todaro, Co-Chairpersons: The May Third Thursday Social at Horsepower Farms in Powell had 101 members registered and 11 walk-in additions. There has been an increase in social event attendance year over year. The next social will be held Saturday, June 20th, 4 p.m., at Executive Storage Estates in Plain City. There will be drinks, light snacks, food trucks, and music by Anything Blue. In an effort to increase interest in MORPCA and club membership, Frank is gathering marketing materials to use at the Arthritis Foundation Charity Auto Show. Members and potential members can stop by for a Cars & Coffee-style event, 10

a.m. to noon, and from noon to 4 p.m. at an information booth under a tent. The group discussed ways to increase membership through possible discounts and QR electronic registration. Frank is looking for volunteers to help at the show.

Concours/P2O by Mat Allison, Chairperson: No report. See Frank's notes, above.

Driving Events by Kevin Hennessy and Mike Stoner, Co-Chairpersons:

Drive & Dine was a success. Jose didn't attend the meeting but reported that using radios during the drives would be helpful. It's time to consider charging for the drives, especially since the drives have been selling out quickly. Steve will work with Jose to research radios and to develop criteria for successful group leaders.

Teen Driving: The first of three Maria's Message teen driving events will be held June 13th. Lots of newly recruited coaches will be available.

Driving Education: The HPDE starting on June 26th is all set with strong participation for both classroom and track. In addition to HPDE, DE Lite, and the track experience, there will be multiple ways to get involved, with a Drive & Dine to the track for charity parade laps and, once the track is cold, Members Day with food, drink, and swag sponsored by The Wyler Collection in Dublin. This will be the first driving event implementing the new Chief Driving Instructor program. Volunteers are needed to help make the event a success. Kevin is waiting on an answer from MOSCC about applying the \$5000 deposit from the canceled weekend to a future date in 2027. Dates for HPDE in 2027 are undetermined. The group discussed encouraging young drivers to participate in DE events. DE is for anyone, even if they don't drive a Porsche.

Great Drives Pittsburgh: Mike reported there are 44 people and 22 Porsches registered for Great Drives Pittsburgh, including members from other regions. Registration closes soon.

Safety by Chip Henderson, Chairperson: No report.

Technical by Jeff Brubaker, Chairperson: No report.

Philanthropy by Mike Stoner, Chairperson: No report.

Old Business by Steve Eisenbrown, Chairperson: Jim will look into ordering Square readers to go with the Square software.

New Business by Steve Eisenbrown, Chairperson: Steve will work with Brian Peterson who has designed updated club shirts. Steve has MORPCA's 60th Anniversary marketing materials available to share at upcoming events. Bob Curley will chair the Nominating Committee for Board positions opening in 2027. Additional committee members were discussed. Maria's Message: Making Safer Drivers, One Teen at a Time

More than 70 young drivers took a major step toward safer driving when MORPCA instructors gathered at Safelite Auto Glass headquarters near Sawmill Road and I-270 for the first of three Maria's Message Teen Driving Clinics.

The day begins with classroom instruction before students head out to three hands-on driving exercises designed to build skills and confidence behind the wheel. Participants practice accident-avoidance maneuvers, threshold braking, and vehicle control on a wet skid pad, all under the guidance of experienced MORPCA instructors riding along with them.

For many teens, this is the first opportunity to experience how a vehicle reacts in emergency situations in a safe, controlled environment. The lessons learned can make a lifelong difference and may even help prevent a future accident.

Sponsored by Safelite Auto Glass, 10TV, and other community partners, Maria's Message is offered free of charge to participants. If you have a teenage driver in your family, this program is highly recommended. Some insurance companies may even offer discounts for completing the course. Upcoming clinic dates can be found on the MORPCA calendar.

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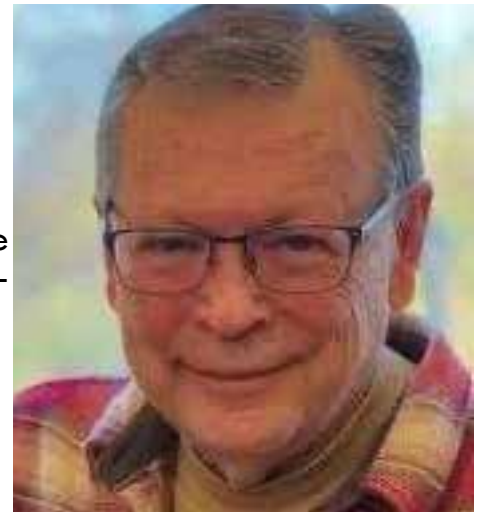




Bruce Pickering 1943-2026
